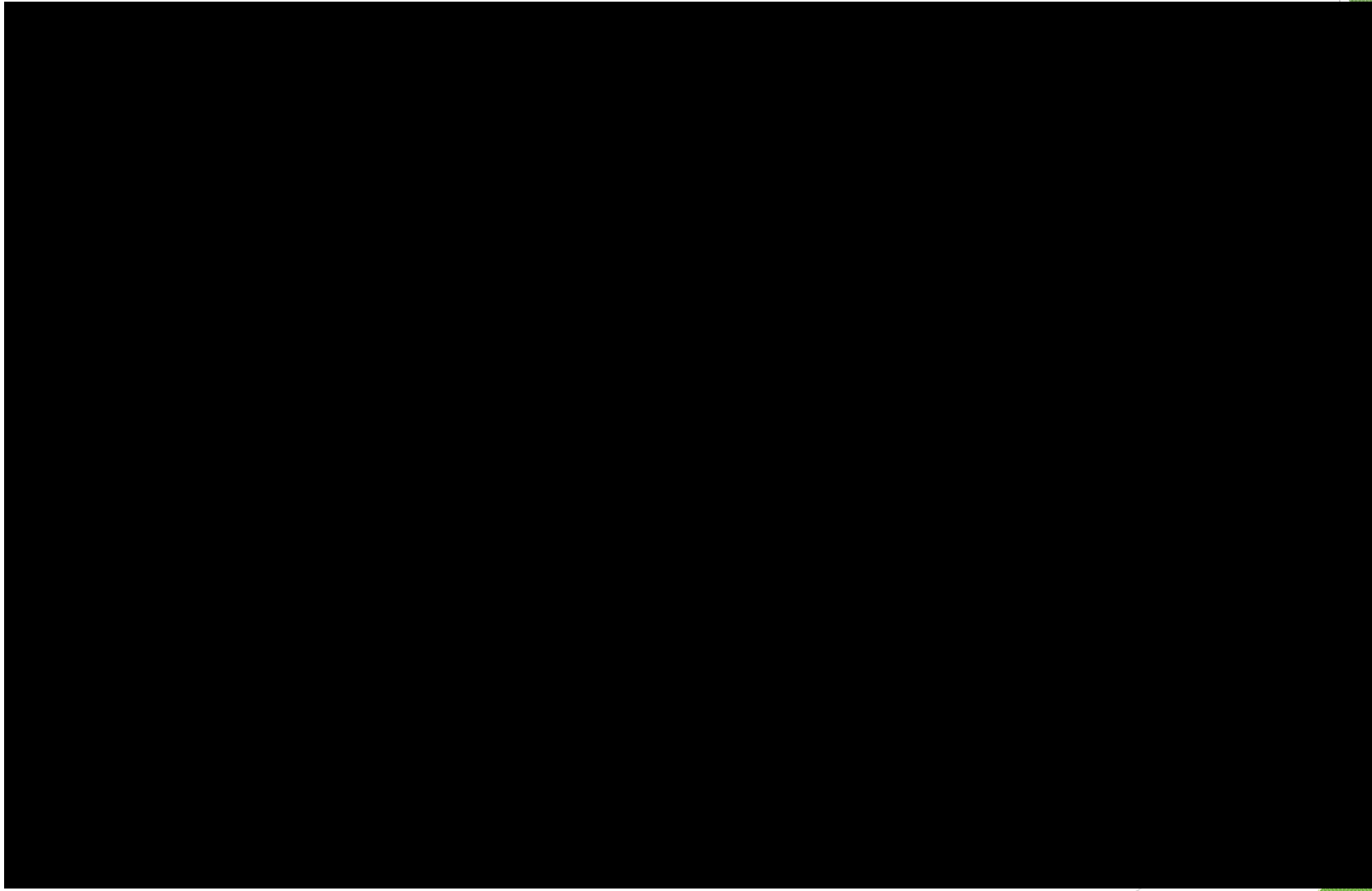

How the new National Curriculum is being assessed

- ▶ Your child's class teacher will assess his or her work against criteria provided by the Department for Education (DfE) in reading, writing, maths and science.
- ▶ Your child will also take part in formal tests that have been set by the DfE for reading, writing and maths. The tests will be marked online by external markers.
- ▶ The class teacher will decide whether your child is "Working At The Expected Standard" or "Working At Greater Depth Within The Expected Standard" .
- ▶ If your child has not yet reached the Expected Standard, his or her class teacher will decide whether their work meets the criteria for "Working Towards The Expected Standard" . If not, they will decide if their achievements should be described as "Foundations For The Expected Standard" , "Early Development of the Expected Standard" or "Growing Development of the Expected Standard" using criteria set by the DfE.

The standards that have replaced National Curriculum Levels

- ▶ P-Scales
- ▶ Foundations for the expected standard
- ▶ Early development of the expected standard
- ▶ Growing development of the expected standard
- ▶ Working towards the expected standard
- ▶ Working at the expected standard
- ▶ Working at greater depth within the expected standard



Aspects of grammar and punctuation that the children are expected to learn about:

- ▶ active and passive voice
- ▶ articles
- ▶ auxiliary verbs
- ▶ conjunctions
- ▶ determiners
- ▶ fronted adverbials
- ▶ homophones
- ▶ main and subordinate clauses
- ▶ prepositional phrases
- ▶ subjunctives
- ▶ using apostrophes for spelling contractions correctly and for both singular and plural possession
- ▶ use of inverted commas and other punctuation (such as a comma after the reporting clause) to punctuate direct speech
- ▶ using brackets, dashes and commas to indicate parenthesis
- ▶ use of the semi-colon, colon and dash to mark the boundary between independent clauses
- ▶ use of colons to introduce lists and semi-colons within lists
